RULES AND REGULATIONS

Contestant Eligibility: All contestants shall, on the date of competition:

1. Have obtained the age of:
 - a. 18 – 23 years (Queen)
 - b. 14 years through 17 years (Princess)
 - c. 10 through 13 (Little Miss)

- d. 9 and under (Junior Little Miss)
2. Be willing to abide by all rules and regulations presented to them upon signing the entry form.
3. Submit a copy of their birth certificate, the entry form, entry fee (\$50.00 - Queen), (\$35.00 -Princess), (\$25.00 - Little Miss), (\$20.00 - Junior Little Miss), and a 5" x 7" photograph. The entry fee is non-refundable.
4. Be available for all events for the dates of August 3rd through August 10 (winners must also be available August 11th and 12th).

Judging Guidelines:

Contestants will be judged on the following three categories, with equal emphasis given to all three:

- **Horsemanship**
- **Personality**
- **Projection and Presentation**

Judges have been selected for their knowledge of horsemanship and rodeo and public relations.

The conduct of the contestants prior to, during and after the competition shall be lady-like in all situations.

Contestants will be judged on their strength of character and personality, projection of a wholesome appearance, as well as intelligence, genuine persona and integrity.

The participation and commitment of the contestants will be part of the judging process.

Horsemanship:

A copy of the horsemanship patterns will be provided to all contestants prior to competition. Contestants will be judged on their ability to handle their mounts, hands, seat and position in the saddle. Dismounting and mounting is an optional portion of the horsemanship competition. Contestants will be interviewed on their knowledge of horse care and rodeo and animal rights organizations related to rodeo. Dress code for horsemanship will be general clothing appropriate for riding. Contestants are not required to own a horse, but must have one available at all times during the competition.

Personality:

Contestants will be judged according to their intelligence, education, genuine interest in people, promptness in keeping with schedule events, happy outlook on life, maturity, imagination, and sense of humor in all instances and the ability to make personal appearances with the news media.

Projection and Presentation:

Contestants will be judged on their personal appearance with regard to grooming, knowledge of proper western attire, poise, posture, versatility, and imagination. Emphasis will be given to their ability to reflect a wholesome appearance and strength of character. Extensive and expensive clothing will not be given more credibility than good, clean attractive attire. Western hat, boots, belt and long sleeves are expected at all times. If a contestant has concerns about attire, she should consult with the Pageant Director.

Speech:

Each contestant is required to prepare a speech, no longer than 3

minutes in length for Queens and Princesses, and 1½ minutes for Little Miss, and a short introduction about her family and pets for Junior Little Miss. The topic for the speech will be **Rodeo In Western Montana.**

Deadlines:

All applications for contestants shall be received on or before July 30st, 2007. Please mail your completed application, 5 x 7 photograph, entry fee and a copy of your birth certificate to the Pageant Committee address listed below.
