2. Be willing to abide by all rules and regulations presented to them upon signing the entry form.
3. Submit a copy of their birth certificate, the entry form, entry fee (\$50.00 - Queen), (\$35.00 -Princess), (\$25.00 - Little Miss), (\$20.00 - Junior Little Miss), and a 5" x 7" photograph. The entry fee is non-refundable.
4. Be available for all events for the dates of August 3rd through August 10 (winners must also be available August 11th and 12th).

Judging Guidelines:

Contestants will be judged on the following three categories, with equal emphasis given to all three:

- **Horsemanship**
- **Personality**
- **Projection and Presentation**

Judges have been selected for their knowledge of horsemanship and rodeo and public relations.

The conduct of the contestants prior to, during and after the competition shall be lady-like in all situations.

Contestants will be judged on their strength of character and personality, projection of a wholesome appearance, as well as intelligence, genuine persona and integrity.

The participation and commitment of the contestants will be part of the judging process.

Horsemanship:

A copy of the horsemanship patterns will be provided to all contestants prior to competition. Contestants will be judged on their ability to handle their mounts, hands, seat and position in the saddle. Dismounting and mounting is an optional portion of the horsemanship competition. Contestants will be interviewed on their knowledge of horse care and rodeo and animal rights organizations related to rodeo. Dress code for horsemanship will be general clothing appropriate for riding. Contestants are not required to own a horse, but must have one available at all times during the competition.

Personality:

Contestants will be judged according to their intelligence, education, genuine interest in people, promptness in keeping with schedule events, happy outlook on life, maturity, imagination, and sense of humor in all instances and the ability to make personal appearances with the news media.

Projection and Presentation:

Contestants will be judged on their personal appearance with regard to grooming, knowledge of proper western attire, poise, posture, versatility, and imagination. Emphasis will be given to their ability to reflect a wholesome appearance and strength of character. Extensive and expensive clothing will not be given more credibility than good, clean attractive attire. Western hat, boots, belt and long sleeves are expected at all times. If a contestant has concerns about attire, she should consult with the Pageant Director.

Speech:

Each contestant is required to prepare a speech, no longer than 3

minutes in length for Queens and Princesses, and 1½ minutes for Little Miss, and a short introduction about her family and pets for Junior Little Miss. The topic for the speech will be **Rodeo In Western Montana.**

Deadlines:

All applications for contestants shall be received on or before July 30st, 2007. Please mail your completed application, 5 x 7 photograph, entry fee and a copy of your birth certificate to the Pageant Committee address listed below.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

No exhibit may be used for both open class and 4-H

No alcoholic beverages allowed in any exhibit or livestock building.

No overnight camping by exhibitors will be allowed on the fairgrounds.

No manure may be dumped on the grounds; it must be placed in proper receptacle.

The exhibitor must own all entries.

No entry will be accepted for judging only, see general rule #3, section 5 of rules and regulations.

Any exhibit showing signs of disease will not be accepted into the barn. Animals showing signs of disease after the fair starts will be sent

home.

No exhibit will be received by mail or freight.

You must bring your own exhibit and entry tags to the barn.

Exhibits must have a 3-part livestock entry tag for identification of exhibitor and animals. A separate entry blank must be used for each species (department.) e.g. Beef entries may not be included on a Rabbit/Poultry entry blank.

Delivery of rabbit and poultry exhibits will be accepted Sunday, August 5th from 4:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. and Monday, August 6th from 8:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. EXHIBITS PRESENTED FOR COOPING AFTER 8:00 p.m. ON MONDAY, AUGUST 6th WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED!!!

Exhibits must be ready for judging by 9 a.m. on Tuesday August 7th. Exhibitors should be present at judging time.

The barn will be closed to the general public on Tuesday August 7th for judging. The barn will be open to exhibitors only!!

Exhibits cannot be removed from the barn before 8:00 p.m., Sunday August 12th, except by written permission of the barn superintendent. Exhibits must be able to be carried off of the grounds. All entries must be removed between 8:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 12th. Animals or fowl left after 9:00 p.m. will be disposed of at the discretion of the barn superintendent unless arrangements were made in advance for later pickup times.

CLASS 1 -RABBITS

THE SAME RABBIT CANNOT BE ENTERED FOR BOTH OPEN CLASS AND 4-H EXHIBITING

A special award of \$50.00 will be awarded to the exhibitor with the most show points, provided there are at least 50 pens shown in the open section.

Points will be allotted as follows:

- 1st place – 6 times number of rabbits shown in class
- 2nd place – 4 times number of rabbits shown in class
- 3rd place – 3 times number of rabbits shown in class
- 4th place – 2 times number of rabbits shown in class
- 5th place – 1 times number of rabbits shown in class

Best of show - \$5.00 plus a rosette – chosen from all breeds, classes

If your exhibit is to be judged for fur or wool it MUST be indicated on your exhibit tag.

NO DOES WITH LITTERS WILL BE ACCEPTED INTO THE BARN

Judging will be based upon breeds. Be sure to put breed on entry application. Only two entries per lot number. Lot numbers must have a number after them to identify the breed category. The breed must also be stated on the entry tag. Entries will not be accepted unless the breed

is stated. If incorrect breed or wrong sex is indicated the on the entry tag, the exhibit will be disqualified and no place given.

All poultry must be dusted for mites and lice 10 days before entrance as well as the day of entrance to the fair. Animals showing signs of mites or lice will be sent home.

A special award of \$50.00 will be awarded to the exhibitor with the most show points. Provided there are at least 50 pens shown in the open section.

Points will be allotted as follows:

- 1st place – 6 times number of birds shown in class
- 2nd place – 4 times number of birds shown in class
- 3rd place – 3 times number of birds shown in class
- 4th place – 2 times number of birds shown in class
- 5th place – 1 times number of birds shown in class

***Special Note: Judging will be based upon the latest revised edition of the American Standard of Perfection of Breed.

BE SURE TO INDICATE BREED AND VARIETY ON YOUR ENTRY APPLICATION. Pairs and trios must be of the same breed and variety. A pair consists of a cock and a hen; a trio consists of a cock and two hens. Only one entry per lot and variety number. More than one animal may be entered under the same lot number as long as they are of different varieties; ex. by entering one of each sex you could have two single entries under each lot number. Be sure to enter which sex your entry is even if you have only one single entry.

be tagged with an official scrapie ID tag to be exhibited at the Fair. Untagged sheep will not be allowed on the grounds. This is an APHIS rule and there will be no exceptions. To order tags call toll free 866-873-2824.

ENTRY FEE: \$3.00 PER HEAD. Entry Applications must be submitted to the Fair Office by July 6, 2007. Entry Applications will be stamped with "Date Received" and pen assignments will be on a first come, first served basis.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Open to registered, unregistered, and crossbred sheep. Entries are

open to Western Montana counties listed in the Rules Section.

Parent or guardian must sign entry application if exhibitor is under age 18.

4-H and FFA members may enter animals in Open Class competition if Open Class regulations have been met. 4-H and FFA members must turn in a separate Open Class entry form by Open Class entry deadline or they will not receive any prize money. **Please do not request pen space if you already have it for your animals with 4-H or FFA.**

Sheep must be registered for class numbers 1-6. Class #7 is for unregistered or crossbred sheep. An exhibitor may enter each lot number twice. The exhibitor must be the bona fide owner of their animal for at least three months before the show date. Exhibitors must be prepared to show papers. More than one member of a family may not exhibit unless registration papers show that exhibitor is a separate breeder. Exhibitor may have someone else show their animal.

All Open Class Sheep exhibits must be penned by 8 p.m Tuesday of the Fair. Judging of Open Class sheep will be Saturday at 1:00 p.m. All sheep will remain on the grounds until 8:00 p.m. Sunday. **Absolutely no exceptions.**

Please specify how many pens you need on the entry tag. The pens shall be cleaned by 9:00 a.m. daily. Decorating the pens is encouraged. Bedding will be furnished. Exhibitor must provide feed. Animals not receiving proper care during the Fair will not receive prize money.

All animals will enter at the Russell Street gate at the south end of the Hockey Rink and exit through the new South Avenue gate at the north end of the Llama Barn. Right turns only onto South Avenue. This gate will be open at 6:00 a.m. daily for feeding and cleaning pens only.

At the discretion of the Superintendent, a class for additional breeds may be established, and the Superintendent will determine if premiums are to be paid.

1st and 2nd Place animals from each class may compete for Champion and Reserve Champion for each breed if there is competition of breeder against breeder.

All Champion and Reserve Champions from each breed may come back to compete for Overall Champion and Reserve Champion ram and ewe.

At the discretion of the judge, an Outstanding 1st Place animal that did not have competition with another breeder may be asked to come back to compete for Overall Champion ram or ewe.
